Student Research Internship Program at the Scripps Research Translational Institute (SRTI)

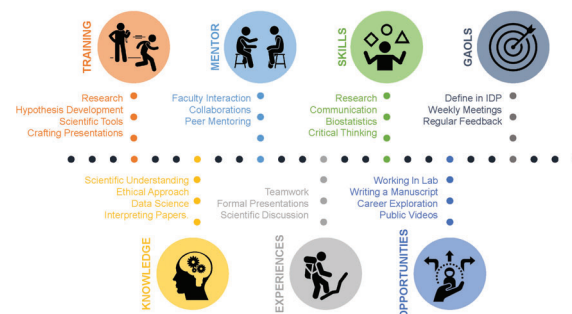

Program Overview

Our primary goal is to nurture and train future leaders in translational medical research. As an intern, you'll:

- Gain exposure to innovative research aimed at transforming healthcare through personalized approaches.
- Develop critical skills in study design, data analysis, and presenting scientific concepts to peers and mentors.

- Build confidence in presenting scientific ideas, findings, and results.

Each intern is matched with a **primary mentor**, aligned with their research interests and experiences. Your mentor will guide you through the program, helping you achieve your project goals and fulfill program requirements. You'll also be encouraged to actively participate in scientific discussions through **seminars** and **collaborative projects**.

Program Requirements

- Attend two weekly seminars.
- Develop an independent research project under the guidance of your mentor.
- Working in a team present a scientific journal article.
- Present your summer research project findings at a translational institute research meeting.
- Participate and present your project at the end of program poster symposium.
