

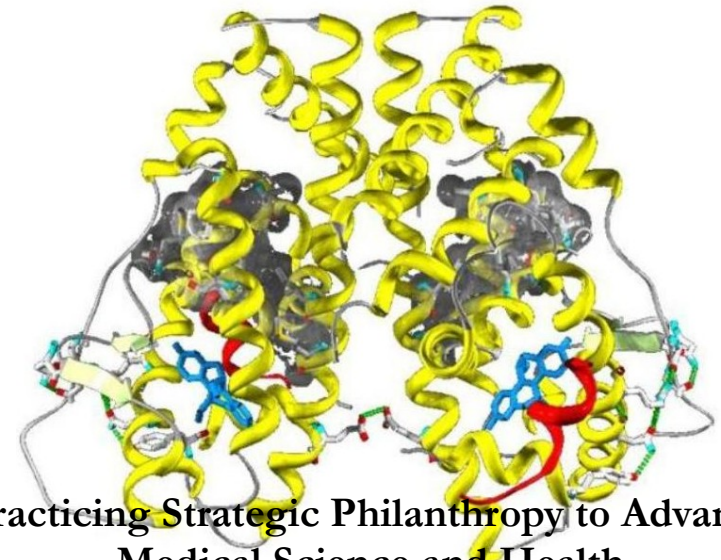
MARGARET Q. LANDENBERGER RESEARCH FOUNDATION

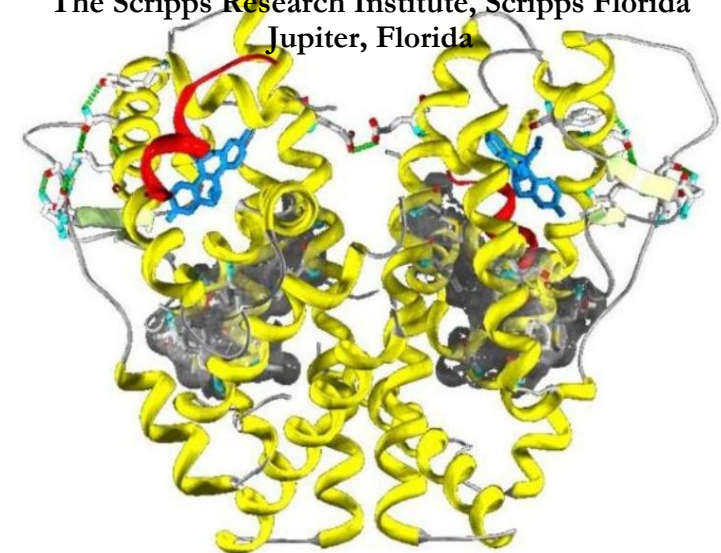
